

ACCEPTED MATERIALS

- **Refrigeration, freezing and air-conditioning appliances containing halocarbons** (refrigerant gases)
- **Appliances**
- **Electronics** (e.g. computers, cell phones, printers, audio systems, televisions, etc.)
- **Items for upcycling**
- **Bulky upholstered furniture** (e.g. sofas, armchairs, mattresses, etc.)
- **Paper, cardboard, glass, plastic and metal containers**
- **Styrofoam at LaSalle and Saint-Laurent ecocentres**
- **Metals**
- **Bicycle tires, inner tubes and end-of-life automobile tires with an overall diameter of 84 cm or less**
- **Construction, renovation and demolition debris** (e.g. wood, gypsum, asphalt shingles, aggregates made of brick, mortar, stone, asphalt or concrete waste, etc.)
- **Uncontaminated soil**
- **Hazardous household waste (HHW)** (e.g. paint, oil, solvents, pesticides, chlorine, etc.)
- **Green waste** (e.g. garden debris and dead leaves)
- **Clothing and accessories** (bedclothes, table and kitchen linens, etc.)

BEFORE YOU THROW IT AWAY, CONSIDER REPURPOSING

Furniture, household items, books, toys, sporting goods or other items that are still in good condition may be dropped off at one of the ecocentres' upcycling centres (same schedule as the ecocentres).

RECYCLING CENTRES

Ecocentres are garbage recycling and repurposing sites that are accessible to anyone in the Montréal agglomeration. The ecocentres take garbage such as construction and renovation debris, hazardous household waste (HHW) and items that can be upcycled. They divert a significant amount of garbage from being landfilled.

PROPER SORTING FOR BETTER RECYCLING

Pre-sorting makes your visit to the ecocentre easier and shorter. Separate materials can be rerouted more easily to specialized processing centres.

For your safety during your visit to the ecocentre, it is recommended that you wear protective glasses, closed shoes and gloves when sorting and unloading your materials.

ACCESS AND PRICING

Population of the agglomeration

- Come in person with photo ID and proof that you live on the island of Montréal.
- Construction materials
 - 12 cubic metres free. Any excess cubic metres will be invoiced to you according to the current rate, which is available on Montréal.ca
 - A minimum of 1 cubic metre is recorded at each visit
 - Maximum of 15 visits per year, except for Saint-Laurent and LaSalle, where visits are unlimited
- Other materials at no charge; limits may apply

Construction companies

- Provide proof that the company is located on the island of Montréal (or be accompanied by a resident of the agglomeration where construction work was carried out)
- Construction materials
 - Current rate, applicable at all times, available on Montréal.ca
 - A minimum of 1 cubic metre is recorded at each visit
 - Maximum of 15 visits per year, except for Saint-Laurent and LaSalle, where visits are unlimited
- Metals, green waste and electronics at no charge; limits may apply; other materials are not accepted

ATTENTION

The length of accepted vehicles varies depending on the ecocentre. Be sure to check on Montréal.ca before coming to the ecocentre.

Verbal or physical violence anywhere on the ecocentre site is prohibited. The city reserves the right to refuse access to the site to anyone who behaves inappropriately.
